The theme of Light in Winter is one that everyone can relate to as the theme of light bringing hope in darkness is an old one common to many cultures. For me and many others the heart of the nativity is the Hope at Christmas, too. Christmas, when all the tinsel and glitz are swept away, remains a sign of hope.

Folkestone is a place where community spirit is alive and well. When all is said and done, this is the real meaning of Christmas - it's about giving, about sharing joy, and about a sense of belonging. Folkestone does just that all year round.
