

## Welcome

Welcome to our latest newsletter with updates on what we have been doing and some of our plans for the coming months. We have been an independent charity just since August 2020, and we are delighted at the way we have been able to develop our small charity. We are grateful to everyone who continues to support us, in any way. We hope you find this update of interest, but do, please, ask if you have any questions.

## A Decade.....!

It seems almost unbelievable that our wonderful and unique Ashford Baby Memorial Garden is now ten years old - we remember the opening event like it was yesterday! We created the Garden in 2013 after raising £30,000 and opened the Garden under the umbrella of the Sands charity.

Those same volunteers went on to create our new, independent charity in 2020 and we are delighted that most of the original volunteers are still involved, along with some welcome new faces!

The Ashford Baby Memorial Garden remains the only one of its kind in the UK, in a town centre, open to everyone and completely accessible. We now have almost 400 nametiles in the Ashford Garden ranging from the 1940's to the current year. The Garden continues to flourish and we are grateful to Aspire who maintain it for us, and to everyone who visits and helps remove litter etc. as well.



## NHS Support

In addition to our direct activities, we try to support the NHS where we can and have recently offered to fund a bereavement training day for midwives and other staff, as well as donating a pram to the WHH for bereaved families to use within the Hospital. In the past we have run or supported other training events and workshops and continue to be willing to consider any support we can to the East Kent maternity and NICU/SCBU departments. Recently, we were delighted to meet the former Chaplain at Canterbury Hospital who had instigated the Hospital's baby cemetery where up to 300 babies were buried, and were able to show her the improvements made in the baby cemetery following our intervention.



## Canterbury

We are delighted to announce that with support from Canterbury City Council, we are creating a small area alongside the river in Westgate Park in Canterbury with wall mounted boards where local families can have nametiles for their special babies – we already have ten orders for nametiles in this area. We are hoping to hold a small 'unveiling' on Sunday 23 July at 1pm, to which everyone is invited. Feel free to bring a picnic.

## Ashford Community Draw

## Faversham

We already have a nameboard in the garden at the West Faversham Community Centre in Bysing Wood Road (opposite Sainsbury's). We are grateful to the Community Centre for supporting this important initiative, giving local bereaved families somewhere local to remember their special babies.

## Sittingbourne and Sheerness

We are also exploring the possibility of creating a small baby memorial area in both Sittingbourne (in the King George V Park) and in Sheerness (in Beachfields Park). These plans are at an early stage but we have had positive feedback from the appropriate councils. Watch this space!

## Ordering Nametiles



We offer nametiles in our Ashford, Faversham or Canterbury areas at a one-off cost of £40. These have one line for the baby's name and a second for a date or dates. On each line we are limited to 21 characters (including spaces) and families can choose 'Baby Surname', or 'The Surname Babies', or may have just a month or a year instead of a full date. The tiles can be ordered via our website

Orders are usually sent off on the 15<sup>th</sup> of February, May August and November and usually take up to a month after that to be put up on the boards. Families can, of course, choose to have nametiles in more than one area.

The Ashford Baby Memorial Gardens, and all our activities, are now run and organised entirely by local volunteers for all babies who have been taken from us, no matter what the circumstances, nor their age. This included miscarriages, stillbirths, neonatal deaths and toddlers.
