
## **TOWN MAYOR 2021 - 2022**



A wonderful Christmas Switch On event with a packed programme was finally able to go ahead after the previous year's event having to be cancelled due to the covid restrictions. Many people attended and businesses supported this event and commented on how glad they were that this event was back.

The Folkestone Museum continues to go from strength to strength and the Committee wishes to acknowledge the achievements of the Museum Officers during the lockdown who ensured the exhibits and artefacts were looked after even though the Museum was closed.



The Committee also wishes to thank all Officers for their continued support of the Town Council, as well as volunteering for the Vaccination Centre and Community Hub during lockdown and for the Town Clerks support in facilitating this.

## Planning Committee

In this year, starting May 2021 and ending April 2022, we began with still dealing with the socialising effects of Coronavirus towards our meetings which ordinarily would meet every 3rd Thursday.

We had a face-to-face meeting on 20th May 2021, however we returned to weekly planning list being emailed to Committee members at the beginning of the week, allowing Councillors to review the applications and give their decisions by return of email at the end of the week, once the decisions were combined, comments would be submitted to the District Council under the Town Clerks Scheme of Delegation.

With typical applications being for small works, minor extensions, slight renovations, new fittings etc with most members of the Committee happy to give consent if the building or alteration were in keeping within the area it was situated in and didn't have many negative responses from neighbours, whom may have been affected.

We returned to the meeting room of the Town Hall, following a vote to hold face-to-face meetings be returned to on 27th January 2022.

Similar to previous years, new developments were aimed at the 'luxury' end of the market with no major projects meeting the need for affordable housing, for renting or buying.

Again, like previous years for the Planning Committee we were very united when it came to applications that were environmentally friendly, especially towards keeping or planting more trees into their designs.

The Town Hall is open to the public Tuesday to Saturday between 10am and 4pm with officers working flexible hours including Monday's.


I would like to thank our members who have adapted well to the new ways of working and for supporting their constituents during another challenging year.
