

Rotary Club Of Folkestone

New president leads Folkestone Channel Rotary into its 40th year.



This is a very special time for Folkestone Channel Rotary as we enter our 40th year of providing support to the local community; and on 16 June, we also celebrated our 2,000th meeting. We're looking forward to an excellent year under the leadership of new President Edwin Beddy and, on 26th June, 70 members and partners welcomed him to the hot seat when he took over from Bill Flavell at our Handover meeting in The Grand, Folkestone.

This was a typical fun-filled Channel Rotary evening with sketches, songs and other homemade entertainments based on Bill's working life in the hospitality industry and as a life-long cricket fan. At the end of the evening Bill was presented with the traditional large, framed picture as a permanent reminder of his year. It showed a battered burger van on the main cricket pitch at Lords surrounded by Channel Rotary members dressed as caterers and cricketers.

Our new President, Edwin Beddy, was born in Folkestone and has lived in East Kent for most of his life. He and his wife Barbara have an 11 year old daughter. Edwin started work in farming but soon decided that his future lay in commercial transport and he specializes in providing back-up and other services to larger companies. He is always up for a challenge and last year he and fellow Channel Rotary member Mike Simmonds drove 1,500 miles around England and Scotland in the UK Rotary Car Rally to raise money for Rotary's worldwide programme to eradicate polio. When the programme started some 500,000 children were afflicted in 125 countries. This year, through the dedicated efforts of Rotarians worldwide, there is only a small handful of cases in 2 countries.

Having thanked Bill Flavell for an excellent year, President Edwin explained "I'm delighted to say that Channel Rotary has an enviable record of supporting charities and we'll continue this with the same energy and commitment. Since June 1980 we've raised approaching £1million and given countless hours of hands-on support to local good causes. We'll also continue our close collaboration with the three other local Rotary Clubs (Folkestone, Hythe) as, for example, in our joint Youth work.

Included in our exciting 2019-20 programme of fund raising, social events and outside visits are two major events. We hope our popular, annual Charity Cycle Ride around Romney Marsh on Sunday 7th July will break our record of 450 riders in support of the Royal British Legion and Prostate Cancer UK; and on Sunday 8th September we have our second Channel Triathlon following the great success of last year's event. Centred on Folkestone's Harbour Arm it will showcase key attractions of the area including the Harbour developments and our prizewinning coastal and rural scenery.

This year the Tri will support a range of local charities including the Shepway Sports Trust and we hope that local people will turn out to watch and help us as marshals. In summary, Channel Rotary is a very special club and we'd love to welcome some new members to share our unique mixture of activity, fun and personal satisfaction so that we can continue the excellent charitable work that has been the hallmark of our Club over the last 39 years."

Town Sunday 2019

This year's Town Sunday Service took place at the Parish Church of St Mary and St Eanswythe on 23rd June.

From 1313 the inhabitants of Folkestone, summoned by the blowing of a horn, assembled annually at the Churchyard Cross in the Church grounds to elect their Mayor. After the Reformation and up until the end of the 19th Century, all that remained of the Churchyard and Cross was its plinth and steps, but the custom of the election continued.

In 1897, Canon Matthew Woodward, amid considerable controversy, had the present cross built using the ancient site. Although the Town Mayor is now elected in the comfort of the Town Hall, it is from the Churchyard Cross, prior to the Service in Church, that the Town Mayor is named and prayers said for the person honoured and elected by the Town Councillors for the Town of Folkestone.



The Town Mayor, Councillor Jackie Meade, attended the service accompanied by the Town Councillors of Folkestone and other civic dignitaries along with Townspeople and representatives from local clubs, societies and organisations.



Annual Blessing of the Fisheries

The annual Blessing of the Fisheries took place on Sunday 23rd June 2019, commencing with a procession from St. Peter's Church, North Street, Folkestone.

Bishop Roger Jupp SSC, Superior General of the Confraternity of the Blessed Sacrament, officiated at the ceremony. He was assisted by Father David Goodburn SSC, Associate Priest at St. Peters; the Venerable Darren Miller, Archdeacon of Ashford and Rev Eileen Webb, Chaplain to Cllr Jackie Meade, The Worshipful Town Mayor of Folkestone.

The Blessing of the Fisheries is held to coincide with 'Town Sunday' (when the new Mayor is proclaimed from the Churchyard Cross of the Church of St. Mary and St. Eanswythe), making a day of great Folkestone celebration! New Folkestone Mayor Councillor Jackie Meade walked in the procession led by the Bishop and other civic dignitaries together with members of the church. As is tradition, local schoolchildren carried garlands of flowers.

The Simon Langton Brass Band played 4 Hymns, including 'For those in peril on the Sea' and the Blessing took place over Folkestone Harbour with the returning procession marching back singing 'Onward Christian Soldiers'.

After closing prayers, onlookers were invited to the Church for afternoon refreshments.

This June St Peter's Church is celebrating the end of a major



programme of repair to the Church building funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund, the Roger De Haan Charitable Trust and the Friends of Kent Churches.

The Blessing of the Fisheries is one of Folkestone's oldest and most colourful traditions, taking its modern form at St. Peter's during the early 1890's. Canada Day

The annual Canada Day Service in Folkestone which commemorates the 305 Canadian soldiers who died during WWI and are buried in the Shorncliffe Military Cemetery took place on Monday 1 July.

The memorial service takes place each year on or near Canada Day at the Canadian Servicemen's graves at Shorncliffe, which is attended by local civic dignitaries, representatives from the Canadian High Commission and Canadian Provincial Governments, the local British Army Command, War Graves Commission, Veterans and Old Comrades' Associations.

The Worshipful Town Mayor of Folkestone, Councillor Jackie Meade, attended the service accompanied by the Councillors of Folkestone Town Council, Major Dennis Bradley (Retd) DL, Major Daniel Martimbealt – representing the Canadian High Commission, officers from the Canadian Forces Support Unit in the UK, officers from Shorncliffe Station Support Unit, Chairman of the District Council, members of local ex-service associations and their Standard Bearers and local dignitaries.

This year 360 children from local schools attended and laid posies on the graves of the Canadian soldiers. This tradition started over 100 years ago and the Mayor of Folkestone stated in 1927 that "As far as Folkestone is concerned, the ceremony should last as long as it is in the power of human beings to do so." This statement is strongly endorsed by all who participated in the ceremony.

The current Town Mayor of Folkestone, Councillor Jackie Meade, thanked past and present Regiments based at Sir John Moore Barracks for their support in enabling the annual Canada Day Commemorations to continue for over 100 years and said "Let us all hope that we can continue this tradition for many, many years to come and remember the 305 Canadian Soldiers who gave their lives in WWI and are buried at the Shorncliffe Cemetery. Hopefully our tribute each year to those soldiers that sacrificed their lives for us all, provides some comfort to their relations in Canada who are unable to visit their graves."



Admiral of the Fleet enthralled by annual commemoration of 'The Seafarers Friend'

The ancient St Martin's Church, Cheriton, thought to be the oldest remaining church in the area, was once again the setting for the annual commemoration of the life and work of 'The Seafarers Friend' Samuel Plimsoll.

The event, organised by the Folkestone Samuel Plimsoll Memorial Campaign, saw more than a hundred people attend. These included five Mayors and consorts, Cllr Gordon Cowen, Dover; Cllr Philip Martin, Hawkinge; Cllr Jackie Meade, Folkestone; Cllrs Paul and Janet Thomas, New Romney and Jurat David Page, Deputy Mayor of Winchelsea with consort Howard Norton. The event was graced by the presence of Admiral of the Fleet, The Lord Boyce, Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, who gave the commemorative speech this year.

The event was opened by Steve Shaw, of the Merchant Navy Association, with a Royal Navy Standard leading the Folkestone Mayor's Chaplain Rev Eileen Webb, who is also a member of the Plimsoll Committee. The Rev Webb spoke of the John Masefield poem 'Sea Fever', which begins, 'A few Draw Down to the Sea in Ships...' in her introduction, but feeling that it was a little too romantic preferred to read a few lines from Psalm 107 which is based upon it and is used as a prayer for all those who are at sea to be protected.

The congregation then proceeded to the grave of the great man where the Lord Warden, some of the Mayors and Angela Conyers, on behalf of Plimsoll's biographer Nicolette Jones who could not be present this year, each laid a wreath in his honour.

Returning to the Church, The Lord Boyce, a former sub mariner spoke to the gathering. In this he first reprised Samuel Plimsoll's life and



work to battle to ensure safety at sea for seafarers in the 1870s and then recounted a brief history of how the Cinque Ports were formed.

Beginning back around the 11th Century, Edward the Confessor granted a Royal Charter to help protect the East Coast, especially the herring catch. Later in the Battle of Sandwich in 1217 the early Cinque Ports fleet beat off the Dauphin of France.

In later years the Cinque Ports and fleet have played a vital role in protecting the coasts during various wars and other altercations, though the organisation wasn't fully consolidated until the 16th - 17th Century when the Royal Navy in full was set up.

The Lord Warden did not come to live at Walmer Castle until the mid-18th Century when it was decided to split from the Constable of Dover Castle's residence. Today, Lord Wardens' have a separate apartment at Walmer when attending events locally.

Lord Boyce also related how vitally important it remains that the Royal Navy acts to protect

both Britain's coasts and our interests worldwide including trade, humanitarian aid missions, supporting military actions when needed including against piracy, and diplomatic visits.



He related that such was based on three main pillars of vessels these being submarines, carriers and amphibious craft, alongside the destroyers and frigates. However, of the last such vessels he felt the Royal Navy was greatly in need of a lot more but defence budgets were under funded.

The event finished with the Choir, led by Michael Foad; singing the old music hall tribute to Plimsoll being 'A Cheer for Samuel Plimsoll' during which the audience joined in the choruses and later retired to the Community Centre, where a splendid selection of tea and cakes were, as usual, on offer by the Church staff.

Looking for work or training in Folkestone?

Being out of work can be a real struggle, especially if other circumstances make finding a job even harder. For those in Folkestone, however, there are support networks in place to help.

Within central and east Folkestone, the harbour district, and Broadmead, there are around 8,500 people who are not currently in work and over the age of sixteen. The reasons for this can be wide-ranging, including being in full-time education, but for many this presents the need to find a job. Just over 40% of the households within this area are classified as having no adults in employment, and almost 30% of households have at least one person with a long-term health problem or disability.

There are several organisations that offer help, including the Jobcentre Plus and Folkestone & Hythe District Council, and now there is a new project offering a different approach.

The Working Together project aims to support those seeking employment or training, and who are currently not in work, through 1-to-1 mentoring. "It's a great programme," says Sarah Taylor, one of the Employment Support Advisor who provides mentorship. "It's designed to help people take a step closer to finding work, empowering them to do so themselves. I'm really excited to be part of it!"

Employment Support Advisors meet those looking for support in their local areas, often for a tea or coffee and a chat at first, and together they come up with a plan to move forward. There is a dedicated tutor offering training and advice, as well as the mentoring provided by the Advisors.

The method has a proven track record in delivering successes for people who need it. Working Together is run by Social Enterprise Kent, a Community Interest Company who already deliver similar projects in Canterbury, Ashford, Thanet and Whitstable. "The whole point of Working Together is to help," says Programme Manager Emma Woodward, "and with support, mentorship and guidance, the people we are working with are improving in confidence and making steps to change their lives."

The project is specifically for people living in Folkestone Central, Folkestone East, Folkestone Harbour Ward, and Broadmead. Participants need to be 18 or over, not currently in work, and have the right to work in the UK.

Folkestone Great War Baseball Game

Baseball returned to Folkestone after a gap of 100 years.

On Sunday 16th June 2019 when the CANUK Warriors took on the Buccaneers Baseball Travel Team at the Three Hills Sports Park for the Folkestone Great War Baseball Game supported by Folkestone Town Council. The match, organized by local enthusiast Andrew Taylor of the Folkestone Baseball Chronicle, was enjoyed by a large crowd of spectators who witnessed the Kent based Buccaneers win an exciting game 13-1.

The Canadian team had been recruited entirely from among serving members of the Canadian Armed Forces in the UK and commemorated the Military Baseball Leagues which originated in Folkestone in 1915 and whose popularity spread across the country. Baseball was played in Folkestone throughout the Great War even meriting a report and photo in Spalding's Official Baseball Guide of 1917, in June 1918 alone 250 games were played in the area. On the back of the Canadians' shirts was a second name tag representing a deployment or operation that was of individual significance to them.



The Buccaneers Baseball Travel Team travel the world playing Baseball tournaments, notably the MSBL/MABL World Series which is held in Arizona on MLB Spring Training Facilities every year & also exhibition games at the Field of Dreams facility in Iowa. The team for this particular game comprised of players from; Kent Buccaneers Baseball Club, Kent Mariners Baseball Club, London Mets Baseball Club and Bracknell Baseball Club.

Presentations and an exchange of gifts were made before the game by Warrant Officer Chris Anderson and Brigadier General Lowell Thomas. The National Anthems of Canada and the UK were sung before the game by trained Opera Singer and Right Fielder Petty Officer (2nd Class) Josee Sulyma. The Mayor of Folkestone, Councillor Jackie Meade, threw the ceremonial first pitch which was caught by game organizer Andrew Taylor.

Strong gusts of wind caused some initial problems for the Canadians who after 5 innings trailed the Buccaneers by 5-0. The Buccs, eager to extend their advantage and hit a home run began to swing for the fences, but the wind held up the high fly balls and they were expertly caught by the Canadian outfielders. Though the score line suggests the game was one-sided the Canadians batted patiently getting players on base, then advancing around the diamond by stealing bases at opportune moments, but whenever runners were in scoring position they ran out of luck before they could reach home.

The Buccaneers continued to score steadily until in the 8th innings the star Catcher for the Warriors, Warrant Officer Chris Anderson, hit a line drive that scored Captain Elizabeth Poulin, whereupon the Canadians briefly threatened a comeback.



A memorable feature of the game was the Canadian rooting, for what they lacked in runs they more than made up for in spirit. After the game the Mayor presented a beautiful trophy, locally made by Atec 3D, to the Buccaneers skipper Jon Carter.

When WO Chris Anderson was asked what this day meant to him he replied: "Today was a great day for Baseball and I believe, for the Town of Folkestone, the entire community really. We are humbled by the support of everyone who came to Three Hills Sports Park today and even as the visiting team we felt like we had the home town crowd with us from first pitch to the final handshake. We did really well today and are proud of ourselves and the effort and result we have achieved. On behalf of the CANUK Warriors and their families we want to thank the Madam Mayor, Councillor Jackie Meade and the organizers for their invitation and this wonderful hospitality."

Jon Carter of the Buccs said "When I was first approached by Baseball Historian Andrew Taylor asking if I knew of any teams who may like to play Baseball vs the Canadian Armed Forces Baseball Team, commemorating Baseball being played in Folkestone, Kent, 100 years ago, I jumped at the chance! Every player involved were honoured to be part of such an historic event & we hope this can become an annual 'remembrance' of all the heroes from the Great War who served & played baseball between 1914-1919."

Folkestone is at risk of severe flash

flooding Could you become a volunteer flood warden?

Flash floods happen when an exceptional amount of rain falls within a very short period of time. In August 1996, 98mm of rain fell in Folkestone in under two hours and parts of the town were badly flooded.

Although flash floods are rare, climate change and an increase in thunderstorms means that they could happen more frequently.

1996 Flood Facts:

- 98mm of rainfall fell in under two hours and 250 properties were affected.
- Over 500 emergency calls were received one every 28 seconds
- 60 people were rescued
- The Red Cow Public House recorded a flood water depth reaching in excess of one metre.
- Flooding at the reaches of the Pent were so significant that a brick wall lining at Folkestone Harbour had to be partly demolished to allow the flood water to escape into the harbour.
- The Pent is now designated as a Rapid Response Catchment due to how quickly the stream reacts to heavy rainfall.

Folkestone remains at risk of flash flooding and the Environment Agency and the Kent Resilience Forum is on the lookout for people in the Folkestone area who would like to make a real difference to their community by becoming volunteer flood wardens.

Flooding can be devastating, destroying property and livelihoods, and disrupting lives. It is therefore essential that areas at risk of flooding help to prepare for such eventualities.

As a flood warden you would have a key role in helping to develop a community flood plan for the area, as well as playing a crucial part in implementing that plan in the event of flooding. Training takes just 2 hours to complete on an evening or weekend and Flood wardens meet just a few times per year to test their flood plan.

Once trained and equipped, you could be helping to raise awareness of flood risks in the area, encouraging people to sign up to receive the Environment Agency's flood warnings and playing a proactive part in reinforcing these warnings, and other safety messages, from other local authorities.

In the event of a flood, emergency services and local authorities are focused on helping those most in need, flood wardens become a vital link between those responding and their community.

Jenny Newham, from the Environment Agency's Flood Resilience Team said: "Many people find becoming a flood warden can be extremely rewarding. Whether it's providing practical support and reassurance to flood victims, or acting as a go-between to provide timely information and advice-you will be making a positive difference to people, helping the people of Folkestone when they need it most."

Stay on top of your health during your Summer Holiday

When the long-awaited summer holiday finally comes around, you're likely to be so excited that nothing else is on your mind other than your holiday.

During the lead up to your trip, when you've been so busy focusing on the latest season's fashion, the best exchange rates, and what tourist attractionas you'll be visiting, our health can quite easily fall to the bottom of the list of things to think about. Of course, no-one anticipates falling ill during their holiday and the last thing that's going to be on your mind is whether you've packed paracetamol, plasters, and compression socks, but a quick visit to your doctors or a chat with your local pharmacy before you jet off can help you to avoid some of the most common illnesses which could potentially ruin your well-deserved break.

Check out our top tips to stay on top of your health this summer below!

Control Travel Sickness

If you're prone to feeling sick when you travel then there are various remedies available. There are a lot of over the counter medication's which can be purchased but do be sure to have a quick word with the pharmacist if you are taking any other medication to ensure that whatever sickness tablets you buy do not affect any existing medication which is being taken. When taking travel sickness tablets, it's worth noting that alcohol should be avoided. On top of this, if possible, ensuring there is a good level of ventilation and encouraging the sufferer to look out of the window instead of reading a book and playing games will help to reduce the symptoms.

Avoid Deep Vein Thrombosis (DVT)

Each year, DVT affects around 1 person in every 1,000. Deep vein thrombosis (DVT) is a blood clot that develops within a deep vein in the body, usually in the leg, which causes pain and swelling and may lead to complications such as pulmonary embolism.

Being inactive for long periods, for example during a long journey, is one of the risk factors of DVT so to help reduce the risk, if possible, have a walk around or try to do leg and calf exercises every 30 minutes. Wearing compression stockings and loose clothing from the waist down, as well as staying hydrated by drinking plenty of water also helps to reduce the risk.

Don't get sunburnt

The majority of us enjoy catching a lovely tan when we're on holiday however there are safe ways to go about it. To avoid red, hot and sore skin from sunburn and an increased risk to skin cancer, it is recommended that children wear a sunscreen with a rating of at least SPF30 and adults SPF15- make sure you have the correct sunscreen for your holiday and you bear in mind what location you're travelling to. Sunscreen should be applied liberally before going out in the sun and reapplied every couple of hours throughout the day. Following a day in the sun, apply aftersun cream or spray and drink plenty of water to cool down, prevent dehydration and sun stroke. If you do get sunburnt, keep the skin covered away from direct sunlight until the skin has fully healed, take painkillers to help reduce any pain and cool your skin with a cool shower, bath or damp towel.

Stay stomach bug free

It is very common to suffer from sickness and diarrhoea on holiday when contaminated water or food has been consumed. Following the rule of 'cook it, boil it, peel it or forget it' and making sure you practice good hygiene on holiday will help you avoid the chances of cholera.
