Therefore you must be aged 75 or over on 31st

Ledley King Opens Walter Tull Exhibition



On 27th September, Tottenham Hotspur Club Ambassador Ledley King opened Walter Tull: His Life and Legacy, a special exhibition at Folkestone Museum.

Local young sports fans were invited to meet the former England player and be the first to see the new exhibition. Ledley answered questions from the young audience and talked about his time at Tottenham and England.

The exhibition, which is open until Thursday 31st January 2019, features letters, photographs and artefacts from Tull's childhood growing up in Folkestone, his



time at an orphanage in Bethnal Green and his footballing and military careers.

The opening of the exhibition coincides with the centenary of Walter's death, Black History Month and the centenary of the end of the First World War.

After making his mark as a talented local football player, Tull went on to become one of Britain's first professional players from a black heritage, playing first for Clapton FC before being signed by Tottenham Hotspur and later transferring to Northampton Town.

When war broke out, Tull enlisted in the Footballers' Battalion of the Middlesex Regiment and became the first black combat officer in the British Army. He was mentioned in despatches and recommended for the Military Cross for his bravery in the face of enemy fire. Sadly, he died during the Battle of the Somme on March 25, 1918.

Amongst the attendees were local school children who had the chance to be the first to see the new exhibition.

Ledley said: "It's important to remember Walter Tull and educate the next generation about his incredible story. I am honoured to have opened this exhibition and have enjoyed observing the artefacts and learning more about his story."

All items for Walter Tull: His Life and Legacy have been kindly loaned from the Finlayson Family Archive, the Children's Home and Orphanage, Tottenham Hotspur Football Club and the National Army Museum.

Hundreds of people took advantage of the late summer sun and enjoyed live music and entertainment and food, drink and craft stalls long with lots of fundraising activities.

Folkestone's First 'Big Cake Off' provided the ultimate baking competition where passionate baking fans competed to be Folkestone's Best Amateur Baker, Cup Cake Competition and Main Cake Competition with prizes and trophies.

Judges included the Folkestone Town Mayor, Cllr Ann Berry, and Angela Butler from Django's in Rendezvous Street. Folkestone Festivals and The Mariner were grateful for their time and very considered judgement before making a final difficult decision. A third judge Zoe Wynne from the Cake Junction in the Old High Street was very sad to pull out at the last minute due to family circumstances but wished all contestants well.

£535 was raised during the day and proceeds from the event are being donated to the Beacon School.







Folkestone Festivals – Music Festival



The first of an official Folkestone Festivals Music Festival took place on Saturday, 14th July and what a great day at The Leas Bandstand with a full day of non-stop, toe tapping music.

Music came from the brilliant Community Swing Band Quartet from Folkestone. Ron Greenwood on drums, Jeff Bonner on Sax, Paul Edwards on Piano etc. The FCSB meets every Saturday morning from 09.30 to 12.30 at the Folkestone Academy.

The amazing Shadows Tribute Band "The Runaways" from Kent who play across the UK and Europe with their authentic Shadows classics, hits from the 60's and Rock'n Roll music. Crowds also enjoyed a brilliant display of Rock'Roll dancing with the TEENYBOPPERS The great Orfila Trio – UK Country Music Trio consisting of siblings Abi, Louise and Matt Orfila, originally formed in Folkestone first performing in mid 2012 when they supported the BBC Radio 2 playlist singer/songwriter Ben Montague and later that year supported UK rock band Dodgy, Canadian folk artist Andrew James O'Brien and Irish folk legend Sharon Shannon

They released their debut album "Writing on the Wall in the summer of 2014 which resulted in the band opening the main stage at the Gibraltar Music Festival and again in 2016.

Their single "Come Back" reached number 9 in the Irish Country Music Charts. In 2016 the band won the Country 2 Country music festival at the O2 Arena and are now Yamaha. supported artists and the "Never Slowin' Down" albums lead single "It Would Be You" rose to the top 10 of the iTunes UK Country Chart. "An incredibly talented trio; superb" Dave Cash BBC Radio Kent. "One of the UK's top country acts" Maverick magazine. (Abi – vocals, piano, percussion), Louise (Vocals, piano, guitar, tambourine), Matt (Guitar, vocals, harmonica, banjo, ukulele). Orfila's recent singles are "Snow, Rain and a Hurricane" (which featured as track of the day on BBC - Introducing the South) and "Built with a Dreamer's Hand" (with Maverick magazine giving the release 5 stars).

On 28th of September, over 75 people braved the elements to sleep out overnight to raise funds for the Rainbow Centre.

This is the 6th year that the event has been run, raising funds for the Folkestone based charity working to tackle homelessness and supporting people in crisis. A wide range of people took on the challenge including Folkestone Mayor, Councillor Ann Berry and Deputy Mayor, Councillor Richard Wallace. The Rainbow Centre is one of Councillor Berry's Charities of the Year and the organisation is immensely grateful for her support, particularly swapping her bed for a cardboard shelter for the evening! Many other community groups were represented including local Scouts, a small group of children from Cheriton Primary School, the Labour party and local businesses.

Organiser Sarah Elliott said: "As well as having fun with games, a shelter building competition and a chip supper, our sleepers were asked on the night to think about the reasons they had chosen to sleep out and the responses were very varied and personal.

They reflected all of the different services Rainbow Centre offers, not just for those experiencing homelessness, but also the family services we offer including Foodbank".

The CEO of the Rainbow Centre, Ali Chambers was one of those people sleeping out on Friday. "The response to the event has been tremendous. We had 78 people taking part, with the youngest being just twenty months old, so it felt like a real community effort. I would like to thank everyone who took part, or who gave money in sponsorship.

The Big Sleep Out is our biggest annual fundraiser and last year we raised over £5000 which was an amazing result. I really hope that we can do the same this year. All the money raised from the Big Sleep Out will be used to support our Winter Shelter which starts in December, as well as the Shepway Foodbank and Foodstop and the Homeless Support Service.

There is such a high demand for our services at the moment, and without fundraising events such as this, we struggle to provide the support which so many people in our community so desperately need.

The Town Mayor, Cllr Ann Berry, met some very inspiring people in July. Town Mayor Of Folkestone's Christmas Fund 2018

Since 1974 applications have been welcomed each year from residents of Folkestone to apply to the Town Mayor of Folkestone's Christmas Fund for assistance with their winter expenses.

Prior to 1974 this was known as the Mavor's Coal Fund and gifts of coal were distributed to those eligible.

Each year local businesses and individuals make donations to the Mayor's Christmas Fund and payments are then sent in January to residents aged 75 and over who fall within a certain financial criteria, as agreed by the Town Mayor of Folkestone's Christmas Fund Committee. Due to the increased demand and reduction in the donations towards the Fund. this year it has been necessary to increase the age of those eligible to apply from 70 to 75.

In order to be considered for a gift applicants need to:

- Complete an application form available from the Town Council offices in the Town Hall. from the Civic Centre in Castle Hill Avenue or by phoning **01303 257946**
- Be aged 75 or over on 31st December 2018
- Be a resident of Folkestone
- Not reside in a residential or care home
- Only submit one application per household
- Return the form to Folkestone Town Council, The Town Hall, 1-2 Guildhall Street, Folkestone, Kent, CT20 1DY by 4.00pm on 20th December 2018

Shepway Foodbank

Having to make a choice between paying the rent or feeding your family is a decision that many people feel that they will never have to make.

Sadly, more and more households and individuals are experiencing hardship and deprivation and the Shepway Foodbank is there to help support them through those times of crisis. Sitting under the umbrella of the Rainbow Centre, and supported by the Trussell Trust, the Shepway Foodbank has been working the local community for the last four years. Demand has increased and last year, the Foodbank fed 1,700 people.

To obtain food, residents must first go to one of our referring agencies to obtain a voucher. The agency confirms the applicant's address and circumstances, and once the voucher has been issued, the person is able to present it at the Distribution Centre in exchange for a three day supply of food.

In order to continue to meet the needs of some of the most vulnerable members of our community, we need to ensure that sufficient long-life food is donated throughout the year. We have tremendous support from local business, groups and individuals and we are very grateful to everyone who has collection bins within their premises and the local people who contribute to them.

The race was established in 2006 and it has become a prominent fixture in the running calendar, bringing runners of all standards from all over the South-East in to Folkestone.

The race was won by Marshall Smith from Ashford Athletics Club, in a time of 1hr 14 mins 45 secs, 44 seconds clear of Carl Selya-Hammer also of Ashford & District in second place 1hr 15 mins 30 secs, followed by Alix Ramsier in third place not far off at 1hr 16 mins 12secs. First lady home was Megan Bates with a time of 1hr 29 mins 35 secs. Second lady was Tanya Cornish and Helen Taranowski in third place. The men's team prize went to Dover Road Runners (Alan Wood, Chris Searson & Kevin Hart). The Ladies team prize went to Folkestone Running Club (Charlotte Avery, Carolyn Lewis & Diane Parson). In addition, the children's race was well attended.

Both race winners received a £100 prize courtesy of sponsors Independent Insurance Services.

This year's race proceeds will benefit local and international charities through the good work of Folkestone Rotary Club, with the main beneficiaries being Folkestone Action for Children and The Rotary Helping Hand Project. Race director Ray Johnson was once again a happy man! "With fabulous weather a huge raft of spectators, a great day and we have already received some superb feedback. As always, I am

most grateful for the support from a number of local organisations who help make sure this event remains one of the most popular half marathons in the south east. We have now achieved over £430,000 for good causes since the race started in 2006 and many runners are raising further funds from their sterling efforts yesterday including a large contingent of runner representing the Pilgrims Hospice"

The event will return on Sunday 29th September 2019 and features a prize of £100 to the runner that may crack the current course record of 1 hr 8 mins for the men's and 1 hr 21mins & 05 secs for the female. It is a fantastic achievement to complete the course either as an elite runner or a new participant to a half marathon. The objectives of the race were to encourage participation, assist charities, visit our district and promote good health, as well as increasing the profile of Rotary. This year we held our fifth children's race with over 30 participating.

First indications are that the event has raised in excess of £30,000 and we are hopeful that we can beat last year's amount of just over £25,000. This year's chosen charities are Folkestone Action for Children and Rotary Helping Hand. In addition, many runners were raising funds for various chosen causes.

Once again we have received tremendous feedback from the runners congratulating us for such a great event, by way of organisation, goodie bags and encouragement from marshals. They also thoroughly enjoyed the course and all of the facilities available although some runner had requested we reduce the temperature and remove the Road of Remembrance on the return which is known as the 'Sting in the Tail'.
