## Eurotunnel are celebrating their 25th anniversary at Folkestone Museum!

'Eurotunnel 25 Years On' is a one-off exhibition and will be open for the public to enjoy in our temporary exhibition space until 7th March 2020. The Exhibition explores the history of the Channel Tunnel bringing together original artefacts from the archaeological digs, documentary photographs and an insight into the creation of the wildlife reserve, Samphire Hoe.

Throughout the duration of the show we have invited various guest speakers to run uniquely prepared talks and workshops. Dates and details will be posted on social media and on **Folkestonemuseum.co.uk** over the coming months.

# St Peter's Church Folkestone welcomes new Priest in Charge

### On the 9th September, the licensing and installation of the new Mission Priest in Charge of St Peter's Church, Folkestone took place.

The Service was exactly 150 years to the evening that St. Peter's held its first service. The Reverend Prebendary Mark Haldon-Jones said he was delighted to be moving to his new post in Folkestone, not for the first time as Father Mark's previous parish was the Army where he spent time at Shorncliffe Garrison and he remains Hon Chaplain to the Welsh Guards.

Father Mark enjoyed a distinguished career as an Army Chaplain on Active Service and before, as the Vicar of a large Grouped Benefice in Wales.

Following Retirement from Army Chaplaincy – being the longest-serving Army Chaplain – Father Mark was heavily involved with The Princes Trust, The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme and Agencies in the Voluntary Sector. Members of the Armed Forces were present at the ceremony including General Sir Adrian Bradshaw KCB OBE, General Governor of the Royal Hospital Chelsea who shared Father Mark's ministry in Afghanistan and in the British Army.

Father Mark has many interests, including Skiing (having been a ski Instructor in the Army), Sailing, Riding, Driving, Reading (mostly Biographies and Histories) and Travelling.

Father Mark will be the Tenth Priest at St. Peter's. The Ninth Priest, Father David Adlington passed away suddenly last year.

### Folkestone flash flood memories – Glenda's story

### In August 1996, parts of Folkestone suffered badly from severe flash flooding, when an exceptional amount of rainfall fell in under two hours.

This is Glenda's story – a resident of Folkestone who wants to share her experience of that devastating flash flood.

### **Glenda's story**

"I awoke to the sound of heavy rain; my first thoughts being "Good the gardens need to be watered". However, listening to the radio and the damage reported to houses in Folkestone, this was no ordinary storm.

I had planned to complete an essay, part of my professional development as a staff nurse at the local hospital. I settled downstairs on the settee in my living room with research papers and nursing textbooks scattered on the carpet around me, yet I remember feeling uneasy, not being a lover of storms. I checked that the windows and doors were tightly shut, reassuring myself that at least I was warm and dry indoors!

I was totally absorbed in my work, but aware that the noises outside appeared to be abnormally loud. I kept thinking to myself what a bad storm this was, when I was distracted, causing me to look towards the kitchen window and door that overlooks the back garden. I was amazed to see water almost to the top of them, like being in a goldfish bowl. Totally unaware of the chaos taking place in nearby Black Bull Road, and with my heart pounding, I rang 999 and requested the fire brigade to pump out the water, having had drain problems in the past.

I was informed there was flooding in the area and firefighters were being brought in from Margate. I walked outside to find out what was happening, but finding the pavements were just wet from the rain retuned downstairs to answer the phone believing it to be the fire brigade, who said they would get back to



me. The phone went dead, and I remember thinking I would take some pictures upstairs... I recall a sinking feeling of impending doom coming over me that something awful was about to happen. Surely this must have been an earthquake with all the excessive sounds of crashing and banging very near, or could it be the end of the world was nigh?

Suddenly, within seconds, and without any warning, a loud deafening roar akin to that of an angry bear signalled the enormous tidal wave that came in from behind me and swept me off my feet. As I was forced down into the depths and engulfed in a mass of murky water, I prepared to meet my maker, my end had surely come.

When I came up in a state of total shock, there was an uncanny silence in the semi-darkness; only the gentle lapping of the water sounded, its evil deed completed.

An unreal scene met my eyes. What had been my home was now upended and babbling about in the water; kitchen cupboards and appliances, radiators, furniture, all up-ended by the sheer power of the water.

Glad to be alive and thanking God, I prayed for help to get me. All the while I was thinking was there more to come, would I be trapped in my home and nobody would know. I managed to grab hold of the cushion I had been sitting on only seconds earlier, and using it as a life raft I slowly moved, bumping into furniture and possessions, towards the windows. If I could open a window and hang my head out at least I could breathe. I managed to open the small top window and shouted "help" to the people who were standing outside on the pavement looking in. I later learned it was my neighbour, who had had a miraculous escape seconds earlier with her two young children.

Help was sought from the firefighters in nearby Black Bull Road, and I will never forget the inexpressible feeling of relief when I was two young men wearing yellow hats wading through the water to carry me out to safety – I was alive!

When the water finally subsided, a scene of utter mayhem and devastation met my eyes. I likened my home to a scene from the Blitz – my furniture and possessions were in a state of disarray and covered in a grey mud-like mixture smelling of sewage!

The following days were spent disposing of treasured memories into the skips provided by the council, the dank darkness of indoors contrasting sharply with the summer sunshine outside. Friends and family came to help with a community spirit borne of deep need, prompting new friendships to be forged.

The Salvation Army called each day, bringing welcome food and light into this scene of destruction: they even washed some salvaged china for me. Little by little I rebuilt my home and my life with the help of family and friends and my local church of St. John's, although my health like many others has suffered in the process." Folkestone remains at risk of flash flooding today.

#### 1.) Find out if you are at risk

- Visit www.gov.uk/flood
- Sign up for our free flood warning service
- 2.) Be aware and know the signs
- · Heavy rain or severe weather reports
- Rising water levels with churning, dark water
- A build-up of debris in the Pent Stream that flows through the area
- 3.) Plan where to go if you get caught in a flash flood
- Move to a higher floor within your property and wait for instructions from the emergency services
- If you're in a bungalow or basement, or if you are caught outside, seek shelter in the nearest two-storey building or go to higher ground
- Call 999 if you are trapped
- 4.) Do not walk or drive through flood water
- In a flash flood most injuries -or even deaths -happen when people try to cross flood water on foot or by vehicle
- It only takes 15cm of fast flowing water to knock you off your feet and 60cm to lift and move a 4x4 or small lorry
- There may be also be hidden dangers in the water like rubble and exposed drains

The event was the most challenging of conditions we have ever encountered and It was quite remarkable during very trying weather how the sprit and enthusiasm shined through.

I have received some incredible feedback and overall it was a fantastic day for runners, spectators and marshals as well as achieving its aim of raising many thousands of pounds for local charities. Congratulations to all those who participated.

The race was established in 2006 and it has become a prominent fixture in the running calendar, bringing runners of all standards from all over the South-East into Folkestone.

The race was won by Rhys Boorman, in a time of 1hr 14 mins 43 secs, Marshall Smith of Ashford AC in second place 1hr 16 mins 14 secs, followed by Nick Collins also from Ashford AC in third place not far off at 1hr 18 mins 18secs. First female runner home was Hannah Roberts of Petts Wood Runners with a time of 1hr 33 mins 16 secs. Second female was Hannah Wilding of Canterbury Harriers at 1hr 42mins 55secs and Penny Ellison of Maidstone Harriers of Maidstone Harriers in third place at 1hr 43mins 20secs. The male team prize went to Cambridge Harriers (James MacDonald, Steven Groom & David Worden). The female team prize went to Folkestone Running Club (Victoria Green, Jenny Quinn & Catherine O'Connor). In addition, the children's race was well attended including a two year old!.

Both race winners received a £100 prize courtesy of sponsors Independent Insurance Services.

This year's race proceeds will benefit local and international charities through the good work of Folkestone Rotary Club, with the main beneficiaries being The Fifth Trust.

Race director Ray Johnson was once again a happy man! "Despite crazy weather conditions runners, marshals, helpers and spectators all pulled together to support each other in what turned out as the toughest conditions we have ever encountered. I have received an overwhelming amount of thanks from all concerned which is great and it certainly proved we are a rather hardy bunch!



And so many congratulations to all. It was wonderful to have so many participating and children running as well in those strong winds. The age range was 2years to 76. As always, I am most grateful for the support from a number of local organisations who help make sure this event remains one of the most popular half marathons in the south east. We have now achieved over £469,000 for good causes since the race started in 2006 and many runners are raising further funds from their sterling efforts yesterday including a large contingent of runners representing the Pilgrims Hospice".

The event will return on Sunday 27th September 2020 and will primarily be supporting Folkestone Youth Project. The race features a prize of £100 to the runner that may crack the current course record of 1 hr 8 mins for the male and 1 hr 21mins & 05 secs for the female. It is a fantastic achievement to complete the course either as an elite runner or a new participant to a half marathon. The objectives of the race were to encourage participation, assist charities, visit our district and promote good health, as well as increasing the profile of Rotary.

As always it was particularly pleasing that there were so many spectators along the whole route which gave tremendous encouragement to the runners – it's always great boost to them which helps push them on. We even had some providing extra support for our marshals.

First indications are that the event has raised in excess of  $\pounds 25,000$  and we are hopeful that we



can beat last year's amount of just over £35,000. This year's chosen charity is The Fifth Trust. In addition, many runners were raising funds for various chosen causes.

The event went extremely well, and help was received with sincere thanks to members of the Folkestone Rotary Club, Hythe and Folkestone Channel Rotary Clubs, Folkestone Running Club



including the juniors, other running clubs and the local community also assisted. Thanks also to Folkestone & Hythe District Council and the public for their valuable support.

Once again, we have received tremendous feedback from the runners congratulating us for such a great event, by way of organisation, goodie bags and encouragement from marshals. They also thoroughly enjoyed the course and all of the facilities available although many runners still request, we still remove the Road of Remembrance on the return which is known as the 'Sting in the Tail'.

## **Sidney Cooper Weston Fountain**

The water fountain in Folkestone (at Bruce Porter garden on the corner of Wear Bay Road and Wear Bay Crescent) was constructed in 1897.

It was built to provide water for both the horses and drivers of the horse drawn cabs that used to queue along West Terrace whilst waiting to pick up shoppers from Sandgate Road. It was removed and rebuilt in its present location to make way for the erection of the war memorial in 1922. It was erected as a monument to prominent Quaker philanthropist Sidney Cooper Weston. Weston died in 1893, aged just 50, he was a very popular man, highly regarded, who cared for the poor and elderly. His public spirit and kindness were known, not just in Folkestone, but across Kent. When he died his funeral cortege consisted of 25 carriages and wreaths were sent from the Earl and Countess of Radnor, Baron and Baroness Bissing and the Salvation Army. The Town Council have made enquiries with the Folkestone and Hythe District Council with regards to rumours that the fountain is to be moved, there are currently no plans to move the fountain.

The Town Council will continue to monitor the situation and supports the fountain remaining in its current position and being maintained by the District Council.
