A one-off payment of £300 and can be used to help with things like: Energy bills, home adaptions and cost of travel to and from hospital. You can apply if you reside in the UK, are 18 or over and have a current cancer diagnosis. All the following must apply: - You have no more than £1,000 in savings for your household - You have a weekly income of no more than £323 per week for a household of one person or no more than £442 per week for a household of two or more people - You have not already had a Macmillan Grant in the last 2 years.
