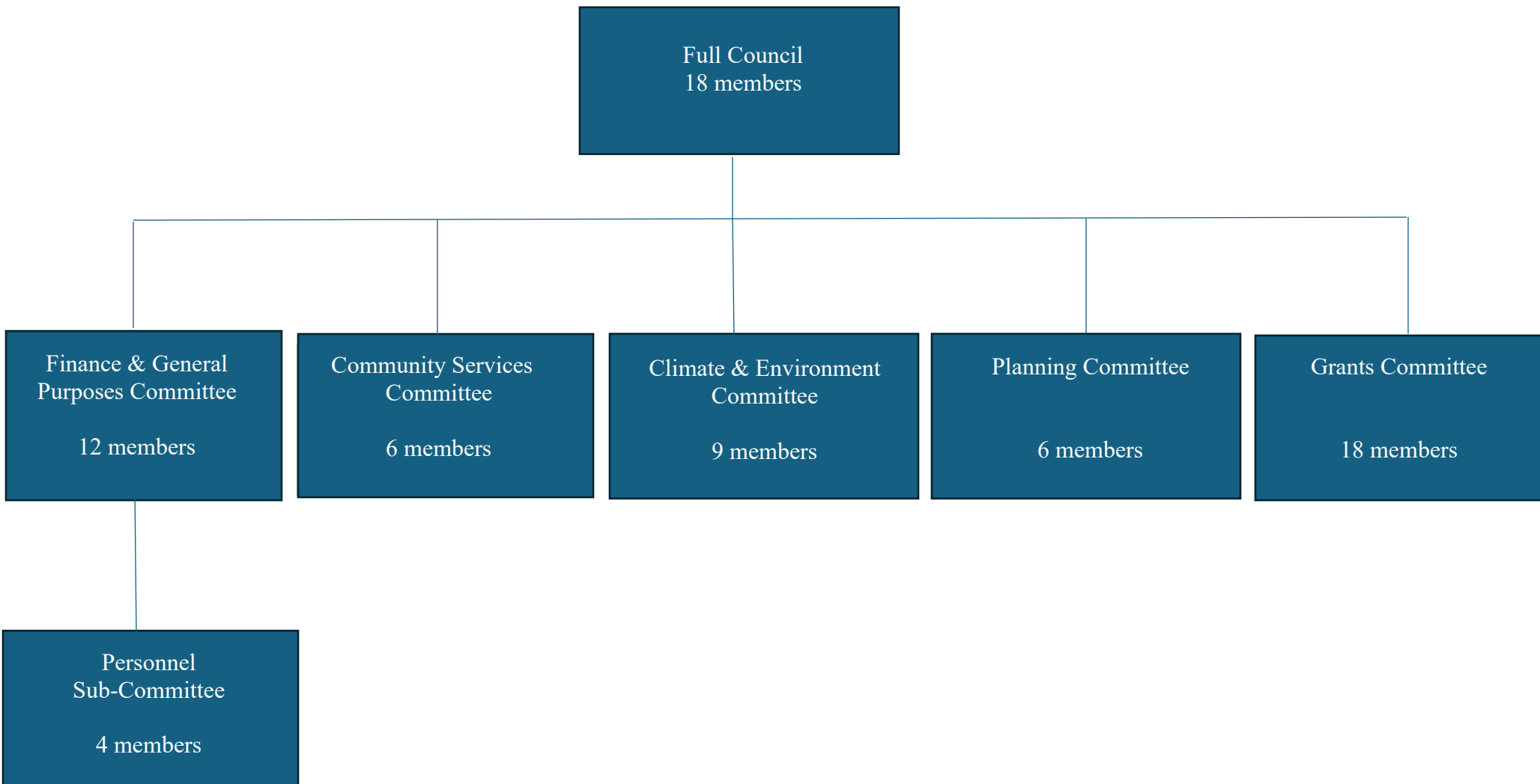

## Community Services Committee

---

The Committee met regularly throughout the year.

2024 saw another wonderful Armed Forces Day with circa 20,000 visitors, an increase of 5,000 from last year. Once again Folkestone Town Council extends its gratitude to all involved including military battalions and charities, performers, cadet & youth groups and service providers. The Communities & Events Officer is supported by volunteers from various local organisations and Folkestone Town Council are grateful for their dedication and hard work in organising and delivering the event.

Although the 2024 Christmas Lights Switch On had to be cancelled due to inclement weather, the new recycled LED Christmas Lights created a brilliant display.

The Committee worked alongside Folkestone & Hythe District Council to develop a new tourism Map of the Town.

Local residents can now access the Citizens Advice Bureau's (CAB) scheme 'Kent Money Advice Hub' at the Town Hall via a tablet device, where they can connect to CAB advisors who are available to assist with financial issues. This runs alongside the ReferKent scheme.

The Museum welcomed a new Curator, along with 31,385 visitors. The Museum also hosted 51 School and Home Education Sessions, accommodating 1,590 children.

There were exhibitions hosted themed around local musicians, artists and even a projection project which saw young adult students working with Screen South and Folkestone Fringe lighting up the Town Hall exterior.

Thanks to all the Officers at the Town Council who deliver so successfully on the events and services for our town.

The Planning Committee meet to review, discuss and comment on the latest planning applications for the area.

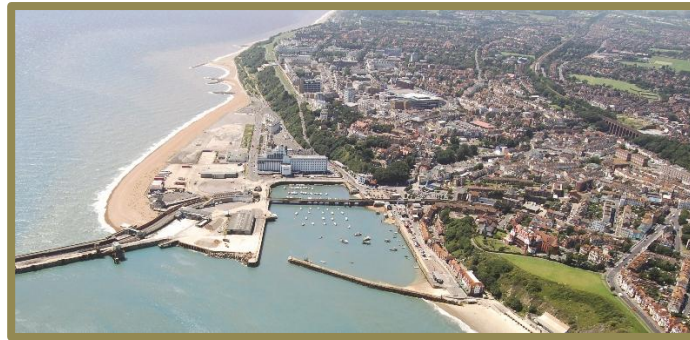
The Committee considers applications for altering windows as carefully as it does applications for large scale developments.

There was also the unexpected discovery of radon which required action and additional funding.

On the positive side, the Committee was able to recommend a budget to Council that had increased funding available for new Christmas lights and also a small budget to investigate the potential for in-house water testing for local beaches. The budget also allows for the continued various public and Civic events that occur throughout the year.

Over the past year, the Committee resolved that works be undertaken to maintain the eight parks managed by Folkestone Town Council and promptly dealt with any problems identified.

Further to continued delivery of required actions in respect of Folkestone's Fairtrade Community status, the Council was re-awarded Fairtrade status in April 2025. Subject to continuing to raise awareness, this accreditation is valid until April 2028.

We continue to annually work in partnership with Folkestone & Hythe District Council and Kent County Council respectively to maintain flowerbeds and deliver a comprehensive tree planting scheme.

## Grants Committee

---

The Grants Committee was unanimously reinstated at the Full Council Meeting on 19 September 2024.

The Committee met in February, where we supported a number of Charities with grant payments totalling £15,407, using up the budget for the rest of the financial year 2024/25. The Grants Committee will meet twice a year, with the next Meeting scheduled on the 4 September 2025.

There are two different types of grants available; Town Grants and Ward Grants that support people and organisations working to benefit Folkestone and its residents. Ward Grants are given directly from Councillors to support activities within the Councillor's specific Ward.

The abundance of clubs, groups and festivals in Folkestone make the town a unique place to live. The grants scheme provides start up help and financial assistance for clubs and societies, voluntary bodies and associations, non-profit making organisations and charitable bodies across all sectors of the community.

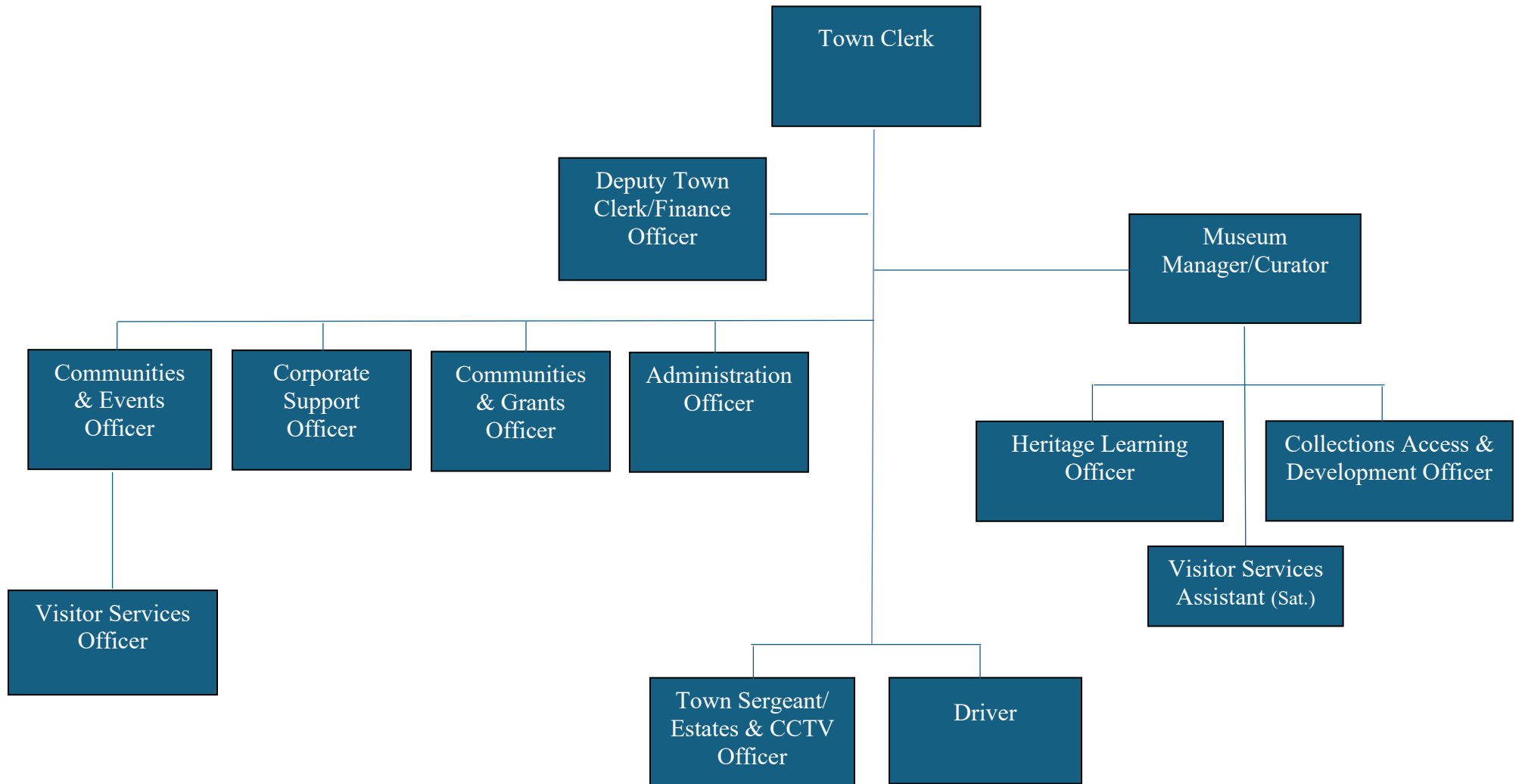
